- 1. (a) Explain five vitiating elements that affect the validity of a contract. (10 marks)
  - (b) Explain five circumstances under which an agent may be held personally liable for contract made an behalf of the principal. (10 marks)
- 2. (a) (i) Highlight two purposes of registering a hire purchase agreement. (4 marks)
  - (ii) Highlight three reasons why the Registrar of Hire purchase may refuse to register a hire purchase agreement. (6 marks)
  - (b) Outline five characteristics of a contract of guarantee. (10 marks)
- (a) Explain five instances when a contract is discharged by performance even where performance was not complete and precise. (10 marks)
  - (b) Highlight five rules relating to presentation of a bill of exchange to the drawee for acceptance. (10 marks)
- (a) Explain six reasons why parties to a commercial dispute may refer their case to an arbitrator. (12 marks)
  - (b) Ndambi ordered 50 bags of sugar from Riziki wholesalers and immediately paid the price. Riziki wholesalers delivered 35 bags to Ndambi who refused to take delivery. Ndambi demanded to recover from the wholesaler the price paid for sugar but Riziki wholesalers insisted they could only refund the price of the 15 bags not supplied. Ndambi intends to enforce recovery of the total price paid through legal action.

Explain the legal principles applicable in this case.

- (a) Highlight six circumstances when the doctrine of caveat emptor does not apply.

  - (b) Collins drew a bill of exchange payable to "William or order". Roney, Collins', Manager stole it, forged Collins', endorsement and then endorsed it to Walter. Walter took the bill for value and in good faith. Explain the legal principles applicable in this case. (8 marks)

  - (i) Explain three types of a charter party. (6 marks)
  - (ii) Highlight three stipulations contained in a charter party. (6 marks)
  - (b) Explain four types of authority an agent may have. (8 marks)

  - (b) Outline five principles of fair trade practices. (10 marks)

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
